Welcome back to school.

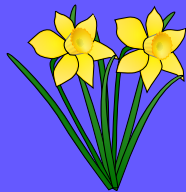

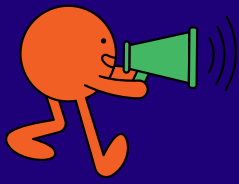

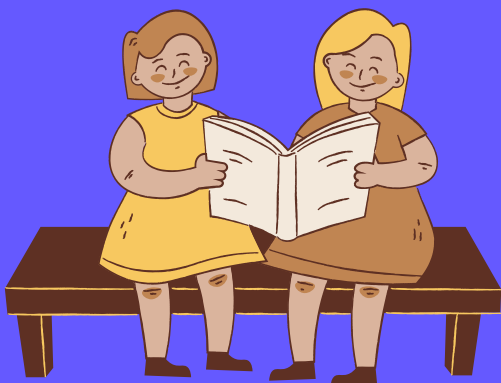

Could travel round the earth

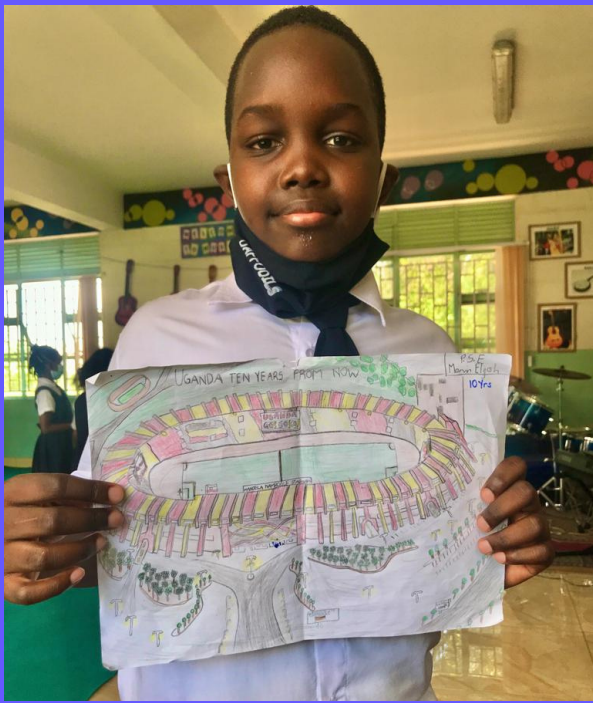
So if you feel a smile begin

And get the world infected

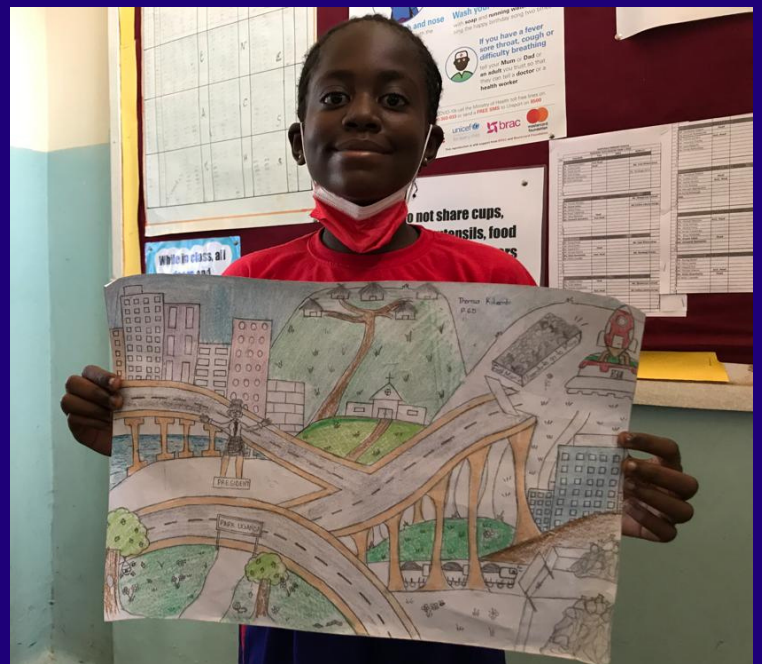

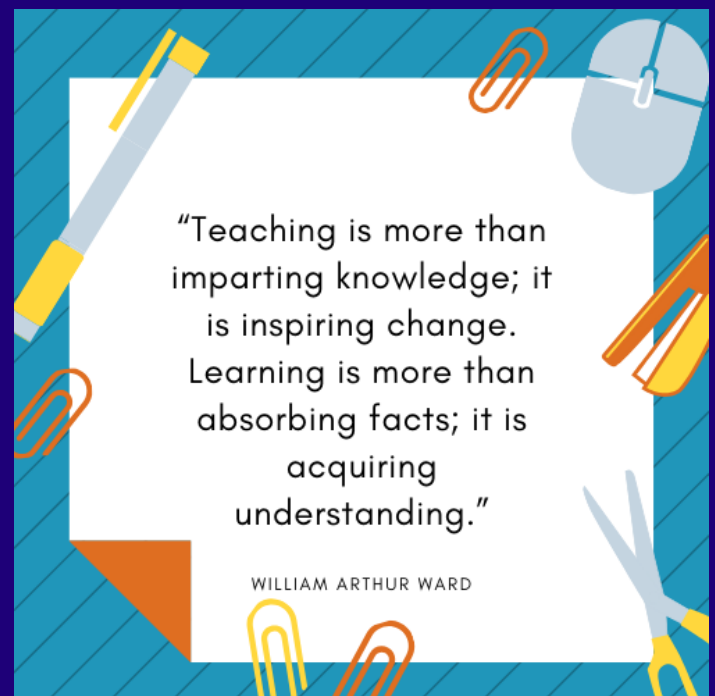
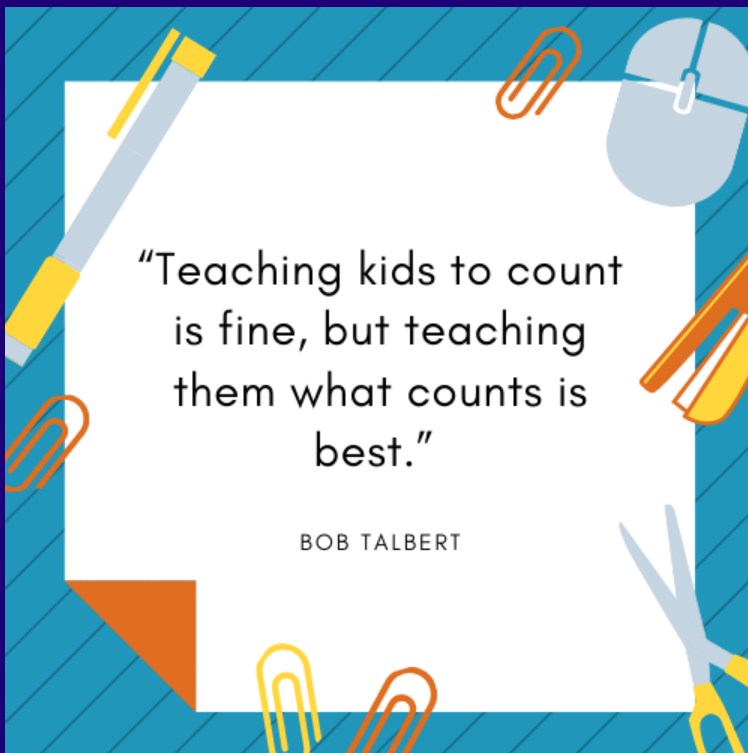
# Teacher's Corner
