I joined scouts to develop my academic skills, self-confidence, ethics, leadership skills that will influence my life.

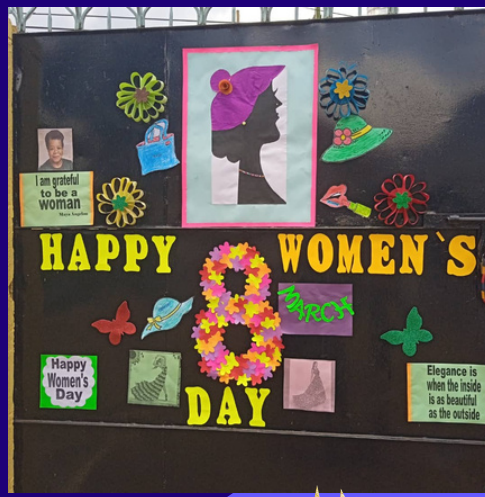
Scouting is a worldwide youth movement which emphasizes on outdoor activities, including camping, wood craft, aquatics, hiking, back packing and Sports.

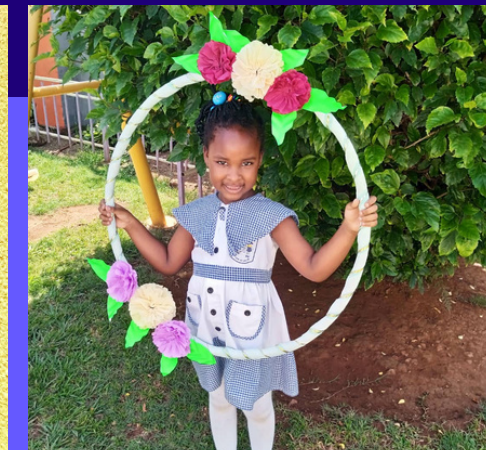

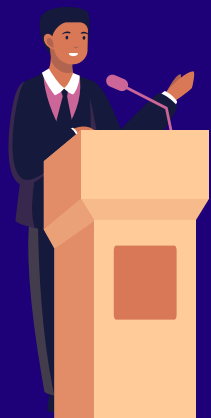
