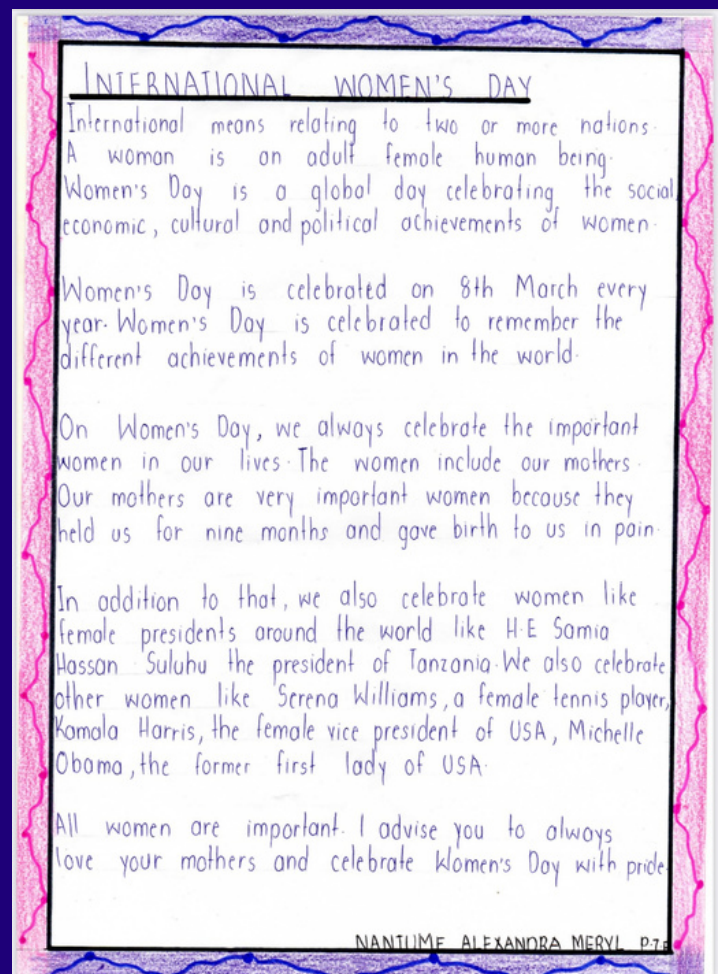
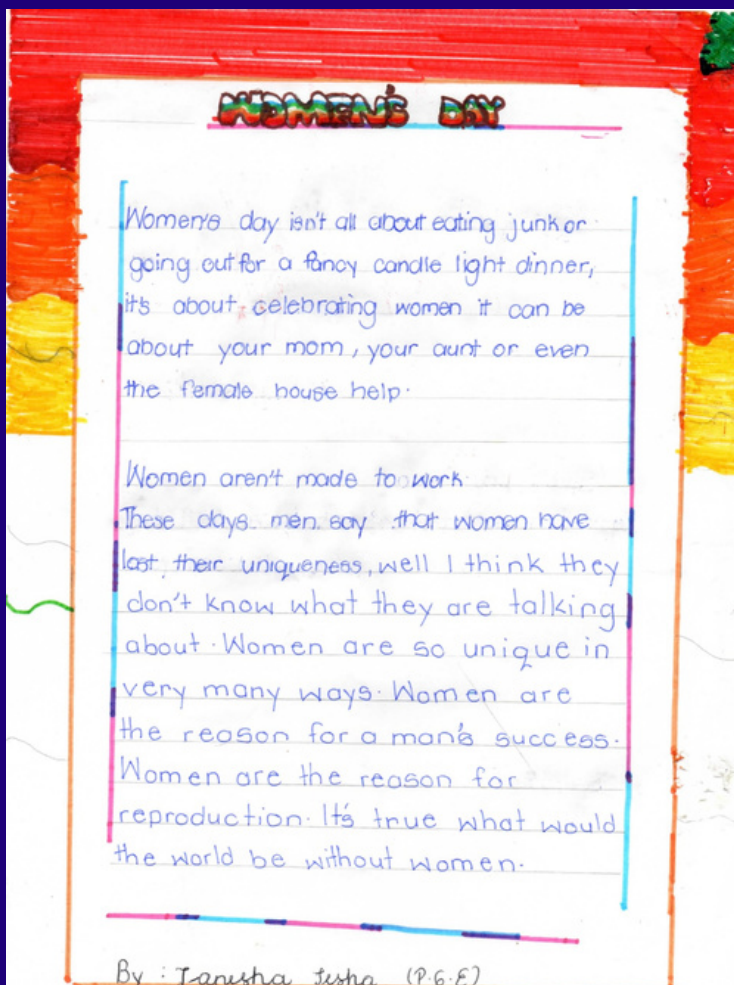


I would like to applaud all the women all around the world who labour tirelessly to make the world a better place more especially for your roles as mothers of this nation. Thank you.

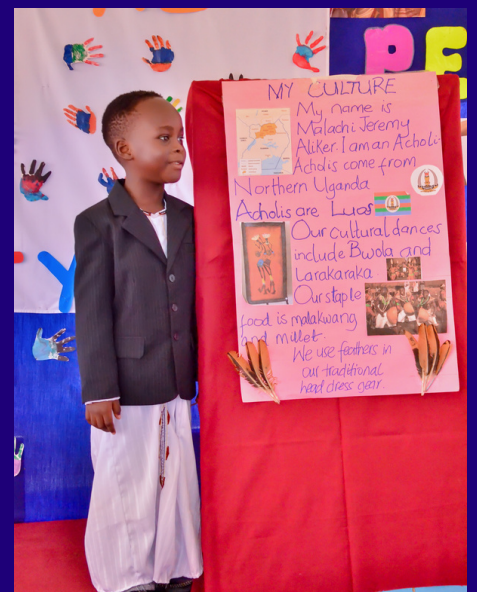
