
In conclusion, I enjoyed this trip so much because I saw and learnt many new things.

One of the martyrs I know is St. Stephen. He was the first martyr in Christianity. He was stoned to death.

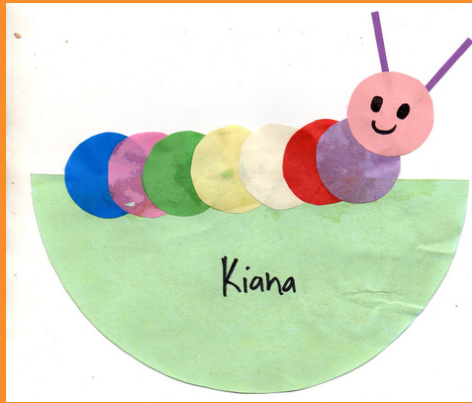
Other martyrs include St. Charles Lwanga and St. Kizito, who was the youngest. They were speared to death while others were burnt to death because of their faith.

People walk from all over the world to celebrate them at Namugongo Martyrs' Shrines.

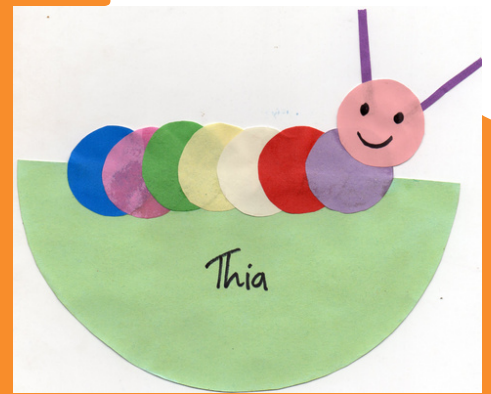

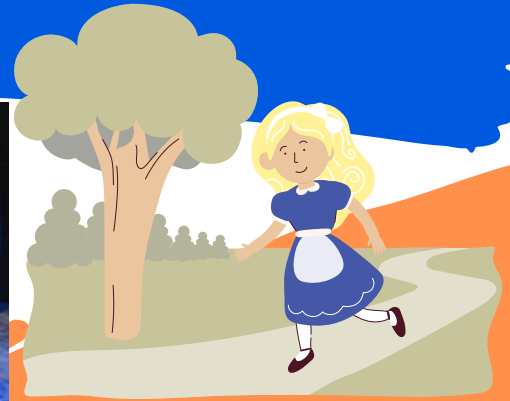

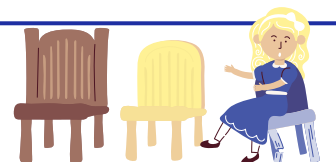
